Overview of Aggregation Switches

An aggregation switch is a network device that collects traffic from multiple access switches, wireless access points, or edge devices and forwards it to core switches or routers, effectively acting as a bridge between the access and core layers of a network . These switches operate at Layer 2 or Layer 3, support link aggregation protocols like LACP, and provide high throughput, redundancy, and failover capabilities . They are widely used in enterprise backbones, data centers, and large campus networks to streamline traffic flow and reduce bottlenecks .

TAP Aggregation for Monitoring

TAP (Test Access Point) aggregation is a method used to enhance network monitoring by replicating traffic from multiple network points to monitoring tools . Unlike traditional port mirroring, TAP aggregation allows N:M (any-to-any) packet replication, enabling real-time visibility into different types of network traffic . A switch configured for TAP aggregation designates tap ports (receiving traffic) and tool ports (sending traffic to analyzers), mapping tap groups to tool groups for efficient packet distribution .
