BS EN 50575 is a regulation which brings together common classification, criteria and monitoring requirements to form seven Euroclasses. These classes have fire performance assessment processes based on BS EN 60332-1-2, BS EN 50399 and BS EN ISO 1716. That's why global standards like IEC 60825 and ANSI Z136 exist to define safety classifications for these light sources.
