Core switches often support modular designs, allowing the installation of supervisor or service modules that manage control plane functions, routing, and high-level network services.

- **Single Module Configuration:** The switch operates with one supervisor module. This setup is simpler and less expensive but introduces a single point of failure. If the module fails, the entire switch may go offline, impacting network availability.
- **Dual Module Configuration:** The switch includes two supervisor modules, typically in an active/standby or active/active configuration. This provides redundancy, allowing the standby module to take over instantly if the active module fails, ensuring nonstop forwarding (NSF) and stateful switchover (SSO) for uninterrupted network operation.

Benefits of Dual Modules

- **High Availability:** Dual modules prevent downtime in critical networks by providing seamless failover during hardware or software failures.
- **Scalability:** Some dual-module switches, like the Cisco Catalyst 9400 SUP-2XL, can scale up to 480 Gbps per slot and support hundreds of high-speed ports, accommodating growing enterprise traffic.
