

Fiber Optic Switch Cabling

Fiber optic cabling between switches requires duplex fiber cables, compatible SFP transceivers, and proper termination to ensure high-speed, reliable connections.

Choosing the Right Fiber and SFP Modules

When connecting switches, select fiber optic cables based on distance and bandwidth requirements. For runs under 1000 feet, multimode fiber (OM3/OM4) is suitable, while single-mode fiber (OS2) is recommended for longer distances. Most modern switches use SFP or SFP+ transceiver modules, which require duplex (two-strand) fiber to separate transmit and receive signals. Ensure the SFP modules at both ends are compatible with the fiber type and support the desired speed (1G, 10G, or higher).

Cable Termination and Connection

Fiber cables should be terminated with LC connectors, which are standard for SFP modules. You can use pre-terminated fiber cables to save installation time and reduce errors, as these come with connectors already attached and tested. When connecting two switches, the duplex strands must be reversed between the SFP ports (A to B, B to A) to ensure proper transmission.

Network Topology Considerations

Switches can be connected in star, daisy chain, or tree topologies depending on network design. For larger networks, cascading multiple switches is possible, but it is generally recommended to limit to four layers to maintain performance. Ensure that optical modules are compatible in terms of mode (single or multi), wavelength, optical power, sensitivity, port rate, and duplex mode when connecting switches from different manufacturers.
