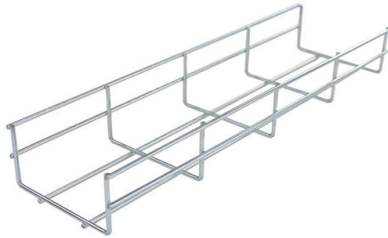


Fiber optic splice patch cord colors
