

How to Tie Off-Wire Optical Cable



Article Overview

To tie off optical or wire cables safely, use the cable's strength members, attach a swivel pulling eye, and secure with tape to prevent slippage during pulling.

Step-by-Step Guide

1. Prepare the Cable

- Strip the outer jacket carefully using a jacket stripper or cable slitting tool, avoiding damage to the inner fibers or conductors .
- Remove any strength members, binders, or gel in loose tube cables as needed .
- Cut the fibers at the end of the jacket to ensure no stress is transferred to the fibers .

2. Bundle Strength Members

- Twist the cable's strength members (usually aramid fibers like Kevlar) into a single bundle .
- These members are designed to bear the pulling tension and protect the fibers from stress .

3. Attach the Pulling Eye

- Slide a swivel pulling eye onto the bundled strength members about 12 mm (1/2 inch) from the jacket .

- Tie the strength members in a double knot to secure the pulling eye. Note that aramid fibers are slick, so the knot alone is not sufficient .

4. Secure with Tape

- Pull the strength members back along the cable and wrap tightly with electrical tape to prevent slippage under tension .
