Unlike ladder trays, trough trays offer continuous support, preventing smaller cables from sagging and shielding them from dust, moisture, and mechanical impact. They are ideal for horizontal runs, industrial environments, and areas where cable protection is critical.

Cable Laying Best Practices

- Planning the Layout:
 - Identify cable types (power, control, data) and their cross-sectional areas.
 - Determine the tray width and maximum fill area according to NEC Table 392.22 to avoid overfilling.
 - Plan the route to minimize bends and ensure smooth cable pulls.
- Support and Spacing:
 - Use trapeze hangers, wall brackets, or cantilever supports to secure the tray.
