PDH (Plesiochronous Digital Hierarchy) is a digital multiplexing technology used to transmit multiple data streams over fiber optic networks, where the streams are nearly—but not perfectly—synchronized.

Overview of PDH

PDH is a telecommunications technology developed in the 1960s and widely used in the 1980s to transport large volumes of digital data over fiber optic and microwave systems . The term "plesiochronous" comes from Greek, meaning "nearly synchronous," reflecting that different parts of the network operate at nominally the same rate but are not perfectly synchronized . This allows multiple digital signals to be combined and transmitted over a single fiber optic link using time-division multiplexing (TDM), where each signal is assigned a specific time slot .

How PDH Works

In a PDH network, each data stream is generated by a clock, and the transmission rate can vary slightly around a nominal value (e.g., ± 50 parts per million for a 2.048 Mbps stream) . This means that while multiple streams can be transmitted together, they may drift slightly relative to each other, requiring complex multiplexing and demultiplexing equipment to align and extract individual channels . PDH was particularly effective for combining multiple voice channels or low-speed data streams into higher-level digital signals for backbone transmission.
