

Should the distribution box door be closed

Ensure the distribution box door is securely closed, properly grounded, and all bolts are tightened to maintain safety and electrical continuity.

Steps to Close the Door Properly

1. **Verify Wiring and Connections** Before closing the door, ensure all internal wiring is complete, terminals are properly connected, and there are no loose wires. Check that phase, neutral, and ground connections are secure and that circuit breakers or fuses are correctly installed .
2. **Ground the Door** Metal doors must be grounded to prevent shock hazards. Use a dedicated grounding screw or clip and connect a copper wire (typically 12 AWG) from the door to the cabinet's grounding bar. Flexible braided straps are recommended for doors that open frequently to avoid wire fatigue . Never daisy-chain multiple doors; each door should have its own ground connection.
3. **Tighten Bolts and Fasteners** Ensure all bolts securing the door are tightened firmly. Use anti-loosening or serrated washers to maintain contact and pierce any oxide layer, which helps reduce long-term resistance and prevents corrosion . Apply a small amount of conductive grease on stainless steel connections to further reduce electrochemical corrosion .
4. **Check Door Alignment and Seals** Make sure the door sits flush with the enclosure, without tilting or gaps. For outdoor or IP-rated boxes, verify that seals or gaskets are properly positioned to maintain dust and water protection .
