

Sockets are installed in the secondary distribution box



Article Overview

To install sockets in a secondary distribution box, connect the sockets via properly rated subcircuits using MCBs or fuses, ensuring correct cable sizing, neutral and earth connections, and safety compliance.

Planning and Preparation

- **Determine Load and Circuit Type:** Identify whether the sockets will be on a radial circuit (single appliance or small group) or a ring circuit (multiple sockets in a loop). For typical household sockets, use 2.5mm² two-core-and-earth cable for 13A outlets .
- **Select Protection Devices:** Each socket subcircuit should be protected by an MCB (Miniature Circuit Breaker) rated for the expected load, typically 13A or 16A. Install an RCCB upstream to protect against earth leakage .
- **Check Distribution Box Capacity:** Ensure the secondary distribution box has enough space for additional MCBs and neutral/earth busbars. The main feeder cable must handle the total anticipated load .

Wiring Procedure

- **Turn Off Power:** Switch off the main isolator before starting any work.
- **Connect Phase and Neutral:** Run the phase wire from the MCB to the socket, and the neutral wire from the neutral busbar to the socket. Ensure all connections are tight and secure .
