A bare fiber pigtail consists of a factory-terminated connector on one end and an exposed, unjacketed optical fiber on the other, designed for splicing into a fiber optic cable.

Key Components

Connector End: The factory-terminated end features a polished connector (e.g., LC, SC, FC) that ensures low insertion loss and high return loss. Connectors may be PC (Physical Contact), UPC (Ultra Physical Contact), or APC (Angled Physical Contact), with APC angled at 8° to reduce back reflection, commonly used in CATV, FTTx, and WDM systems . **Bare Fiber End:** The opposite end is an exposed optical fiber, typically 0.9mm in diameter for tight-buffered indoor pigtails. This bare fiber is intended for fusion or mechanical splicing to the main fiber cable, creating a permanent, low-loss connection . **Fiber Type and Structure:** Pigtails are available in single-mode or multimode fibers, and may be color-coded according to TIA/EIA standards for easy identification. The fiber itself is usually unjacketed or minimally buffered, as it will be housed inside an ODF, splice tray, or terminal box . **Protective Layers:** While standard indoor pigtails have minimal protection, specialized types include:

- **Armored pigtails:** Stainless steel tube inside the outer jacket for rodent and mechanical protection.
- **Waterproof pigtails:** Reinforced with a waterproof PE jacket for outdoor or harsh environments .

Typical Dimensions and Variants

- **Length:** Usually 0.5m to 2m.
